- New sign still to be installed.

### **Promoting a cleaner & healthier village**

- New signage for dog fouling to be put up as some need replacing due to damage.
- Ryedale Council have offered Scackleton a free tree. Do not get any say in which type of tree we get. Steve Britland & Nicole Robson have identified some potential sites, but will review once we know what sort of tree we are getting.
- Cherry Coward purchased daffodil bulbs for the village to allow the in-filling of gaps that had been apparent last Spring. Planted by Cherry, Wendy Swann & Paul Swann in December.
- The Parish Council purchased salt grit for Hovingham and Scackleton. Scackleton is to receive 0.5 Tonne. Rob Matthews is due to collect it and to deposit it by the large yellow grit bin.

### **Traffic in the village**

- The new signs for Scackleton & Coulton banks have gone up at either end of the village. The signs are bright yellow. NYCC will review the traffic situation with the village to see if these cut down the lorries through the village. If they do not, then the additional sign could be placed at the start of the bank near Town End Farm. Nicole has emailed out to residents about the new signage and has asked for feedback on the lorry traffic.

### **Communication within the village**

- Circulating the weekly Hovingham & Scackleton Village Diary by email primarily. Occasionally on the notice board.
- Neighbourhood watch emails are being emailed out.

### **Community Events & Fund Raising**

- Still suspended for now. Will be 2022 before we can realistically restart them.

- Scackleton Action Group will be doing the May Market Café – 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2022.

### **Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee**

- Scackleton to determine whether they join in with Hovingham or not. Nicole & Steve were not residents in the village 10 years ago. Update at the next PC meeting.
- St George's Church will host a beacon for the national celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee at Church Farm on 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2022.

### **Scackleton Community Support Group**

- The Scackleton Community Support Group is still in situ for the village, with volunteers from the village still happy to be part of it.
