TRAFFIC

- White lines chicane on road at Park Street entrance
- Traffic Activated Sign proposal general consensus is we should fundraise to buy them.
- Neither Speedwatch or Parish Council want to lead fund raising so there needs to be a group to fundraise approx. £4700 ask businesses to donate.
- o Cllr. F. Colenso (Frank) is gathering more info regarding TAS grants.
- o Cllr. M. Wilson (Mark) proposed PC stays involved and a subcommittee is formed to deal with it.
- Speedwatch will start up again early April
- o Moving 30mph speed limit sign- would be moved if there was a chicane.

Platinum Jubilee

- Sub-committee, of 10 people, formed after 2nd village meeting. Cllr. M. Wilson (Mark) and Cllr. Dr N. Robson (Nicole) are PC's reps.
- o A plan was formulated on 22nd March
- o Leaflet drop around village on 2nd Apr- create awareness as there's also Beacon in Scackleton.
- o Table and chairs set out Infront of hall- people bring their own food
- o There are ready- made packs from the bakery- to purchase as well
- Proposal to make £500 available to group unanimously approved, await proposal from group on how they propose spending.
- o PC supports the Platinum Jubilee flag being erected outside Village Hall
- Parish Council Election on 5th May 2022, Annual Parish Council Meeting on 18th May 2022.

Moseys Application for Lawfulness – Submitted objection to RDC

- Result day is Apr 1st
- FOI discovered there's only been two/three enforcement actions in 10 years
- o PC to put a formal complaint through objecting- will do that in the next 10 days
- o RDC hasn't done anything to statutory obligations, though they have a responsibility.
- o People needed to state "I oppose this application" otherwise they weren't treated as complaints.

SCACKLETON ACTIONS

- Action Group Report Meeting planned for 30/03/22 in the church first meeting they've had in 2 years.
- Road Signs for Scackleton Bank. One incident a week after where lorry had to be towed out. They paid privately.

Bakery

- Brookside Sign- Serena finally lodged complaint
- o NYCC replacing the railings on bridge across Beck

Cemetery

- o Repoint Wall book someone in for 6 months- provisionally book.
- Path upgrade:
- Wall part finished so needs to be finished.
- Pathway, pipe needs to be buried first. It needs a bag of hogging spread over it and a whacker plate to bed it down. Decision- look for a quote for the hogging and then get someone with a whacker plate? How much material do we need? Check on same person who did the village hall. Serena to chase.
- Updated cemetery terms and conditions- they've been tidied up to fit within 1 page

Coronation Green

- o Railings to be repainted early 2022 when weather allows- Cllr. M. Wilson (Mark) to chase Howard
- Thank you to Cllr. M. Wilson (Mark) and to Cllr R. Wainwright (Robert) for assembling the new seatawaiting weather improvement, prior to 31st Mar 2022. Serena to ask John- to teak oil to preserve it.
- o Claim, £280, to be made for AONB grant, prior to 31st Mar 2022

Hall Farm Cottages

- o Chris's purchase of 4 Hall Farm Cottages progressing through legal-started in Jan.
- There has been no further interest in 6 Hall Farm cottages.

Hovingham Inn

- Closing in May
- Boundary wall repairs handed over to NYCC yet to respond.
- Reported path to NYCC and whole footpath by tennis court needs resurfacing.

Village Hall

- o Car Park Donations, school and commercial vehicle usage. Hovingham Shop paid
- School ask staff to park in Village Hall car park
- Electric Vehicle Charger Signs proposal unanimously approved to spend £101.40 from car park donations for the double sided chevron sign telling people where it is on roadside post.
- o Project Purple will fund blue direction sign inside car park.
- o Front Wall repair, additional damage Cllr. M. Wilson (Mark) says Tosh will do it
- o Flat sign on the road which will be placed where Village Hall sign is £57.73, proposal rejected.
- Recycling area refurbishment. RDC to extend it by couple of metres but may be too laborious.
- Cllr. F. Colenso (Frank) to get quote from Beecroft for fencing

FINANCE

- Finance Summary
 - Surplus of £1,000- due to receipt of section 106 grant of £2,371.50, which will most likely be allocated in 2022-23. Deficit of £1,300 represents accurate position
 - Budget for 2022-23 unanimously approved with reduction in grass cuts from 6 to 5, projected deficit next year of £3700- but we have funds to cover that.
 - o Progress opening new account- Barclays still slow. Visiting local branch again
- Reductions in budget for next year:
 - o ECV sign- dropped down to £101
 - o Budget drop to 5 cuts of verges reduce price
 - o Insurance- cost of living- 5 per cent
 - o Coronation Green- already approved
 - o Parish Clerk- introduces a training element and cost of living rise
- Membership of the LCA- £215. Valuable resource for Serena.

GRASS CUTTING

- Circle Garden Services increased by 7%. Decided to reduce to 5 cuts a year not 6, total £3,531.00. Serena to contact them. Synchronize the cut with the Jubilee. Work back 6 weeks- mid Apr.
- NY Garden Services have charged same amount for last 6 years for cutting Coronation green and Market Square Increased from £50 to £55 this year.

PLANNING

- All planning applications previously circulated. Available on RDC website
- Ryedale Plan response is available both on Village and RDC websites

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- Elections mean next meeting needs to be moved forward as it has to be held within 2 weeks of election
- First Parish Council in the country to have an electric charging point.
- July meeting at Scackleton booked already by Nicole
- An elector at meeting requested clarification on the role of the Chair and Councilors; this was provided by those attending the meeting.
