Hovingham Playground

- Nothing much to report from the playground itself, the park remains active on brighter days and enjoyed on the good weekends, but pretty quiet otherwise. The main reports from our group are financial and all positive!
- The market cafe which was run by the Playground at the December market raised just under £800 which was fantastic, we had help from a few friends and with our small team we managed to cover all the jobs and really raise some much needed funds and have fun at the same time. Thanks to all involved.
- Our January jumble has just taken place and again, with help from family and friends and in conjunction with the Church, we raised £580 for the playground funds.
- We have secured a grant which covers half of our grass cutting and hedge cutting costs £350 Thanks Catherine our grant guru for following this up on the back of her playgroup contacts and info.
- We now have a QR code at the playground to see if we can generate any donations from people who don't have cash on them. In our ever increasingly cash-less society we thought it worth a crack to see if it would work. The jury is out at the moment, its early days and also the middle of winter we are not losing anything by having it there so fingers crossed and I will report further down the line.
- Our working bee will be in spring once the weather improves and the ground softens, I will put out a notice once a date has been decided as we will need volunteers!!
- The funds available to spend at the moment stand at £5,250.15. Thanks to Phil for keeping us on track financially.

Hovingham Project Purple

- Last year, based on our ongoing activities, Project Purple was asked if we would like to join the Circular Towns Network supported by York and North Yorkshire Local Enterprise Partnership. The communities include Scarborough, Selby, Malton and Norton, Pickering, Settle, Craven College, Catterick Garrison, Hovingham, Tadcaster, and York. This will give us opportunities for the "Net Zero" Funding as well as joint / sharing activities.
- Repair Café During 2022, we had a staggering 74 items brought in for repair of which 50 were fixed and 24 advise was given; some to bring back next time with the recommended spare part, some suggestions for specialist repair and some not repairable. Ann made a whooping 40 Moorsebags and 30 Pet beds!! We can feel proud that we have prevented all these items from landfill and given them an extended life, with many happy customers!

With heating costs going up and more than 75% of Hovingham residents using oil and other non-renewable heating today, it's the right time to consider alternative cheaper to run and more environmental solutions. Hovingham Village Market

- The Market has now successfully run 15 Markets since resuming post-COVID in November 2021. They have achieved a modest surplus, covering costs with a little to spare.
- Unfortunately, the supplier of our gazebos has ceased trading; we are urgently looking for alternatives, including
 Stallholders bringing their own. Despite this we are very confident that there will be a Market in February and
 subsequent months. The need for volunteers on Saturday morning and afternoon is increased; more coffee and bacon
 butties are available to help energise them.
- The Market again provided the village Christmas Tree and supported the Tree Shredding project after Christmas.
- The Market continues to look for volunteers prepared to help organise the Market or help setup, run and take down the Market on the first Saturday of each month from February to December and also a special Christmas Market on the third Saturday in December.

Hovingham Village Playgroup

- Hovingham playgroup continues to be a vibrant success bringing lots of families into the village with new attendees every
 week. Our Christmas party was a roaring success. We had a visit from Santa and a small party with games and food. Carol
 singing in the village on Tuesday 13th December funded this.
- We have been awarded another "Get Going Grant" for £1,000 to provide another Fist aid course and purchase crafts and books.
- The number of children varies from week to week, our first week back after Christmas saw 37 children it was very full!
- The school has not returned to support our group, but I assume this is because they are awaiting their consultation decision.
- Finances are healthy and no further help is required from the parish council at this time. The ramblers are proving a problem on the Wednesday, as they park inconsiderably and have started arriving early to beat the parents. They also keep trying to enter the village hall to use the toilet facilities. We have to repeatedly tell them they are not public toilets and we have it on private hire.
