## **GENERAL QUESTIONS FROM PUBLIC:**

#### Sylvia Moss:

- Raised concern over allocation of plots already paid for. Chair reassured that her plot D2 was guaranteed.

## Malcolm Terry:

- Flagged concern around quality of grass mowing and inconsistency between parts of the village. Advised that different contractors were used due to differing requirements of the terrain. This year the weather also added to the challenge as first cut was delayed. Number of cuts has reduced over the years due to significantly increased costs. Villagers are being asked to mow areas adjacent to properties and reviews will take place annually on the number of cuts required and in budget. Scackleton are reviewing whether there are funds in the action group budget to allow for an additional cut.

## Robert Wainwright:

Enquired about the sign for the tetra-pac bin as someone has been placing cardboard in it. Chair
advised that sign should be arriving this week and will be installed. The meeting thanked those
volunteers who regularly tidy-up the recycling area however, users must be encouraged to do better
keeping

## Caroline Clarke:

- Requested support from PC for recent planning application that had been rejected. PC to review plans and submit support.

## **GENERAL ACTIONS (Hovingham & Scackleton)**

- Coronation party a success. PC to review requirement for a Coronation tree/bench later in the year
- Estate Masterplan: More structured consultation is required. Propose questionnaire to residents to gauge support and areas of concern.
- Ryedale Plan: Awaiting update from N'Yorks regarding their plan and implications on next step for Hovingham and Ryedale plan.
- Moseys breaches of planning: Continued breaches outside of timings and being logged with N'Yorks.
   PC have challenged lack of action on enforcement and will continue to request action and update.
   Option to get a traffic order based on environmental impact.
- Drainage. Jayne has followed up with Yorkshire Water and new contact is looking at getting approval for works under £10k. Estate will support by covering groundworks
- Estate Woodland proposal near Hovingham Lodge: 4 Residents from Hovingham lodge in attendance to discuss matter of prosed woodland adjacent to their properties. Planting will cause significant impact to view and light in the properties and is causing stress and concern for residents. Grant applications will be going in for the planting. Residents advised to contact the Grant body and notify them of the negative impacts. Also advised to write to AONB and directly to Sir William making it clear that they are objecting to the proposal. Also to copy in the PC. Residents thanked Nicole, Steve and the PC for their support through what has been a challenging and unsettling time for them.

- Hovingham School closure update Building will be handed back to the estate 1<sup>st</sup> June. No update on future plans for Grade 2\* building. There will be a celebration of the school's achievements during the summer.

#### Coronation Green

- Question from residents around whether Cherry tree needed crown taken off. This was taken off a number of years ago and advice taken that it is in very good condition because of this and should not be done again for a few years.
- Crows nesting- unfortunately due to protected nature nothing can be done about the crows and the damage they are causing.

- o Boundary wall repairs awaiting Cllr Steve Mason on an update. Serena continue to chase.
- o Footpath repair awaiting Cllr Steve Mason on an update. Serena continue to chase.

#### Traffic

## Village Hall

- o Potential future issue with Restaurant Myse opening. Mark to raise with VH committee
- Jayne to approach new owners and ask for support if using car park and donations

 Jayne has followed up with the Estate who are checking with their solicitor who the owner of the land is. Land is currently unadopted so potential issue around car insurance being invalidated if parked on the land. Jayne organizing a sign at end of the highways land indicating that this is a Bridleways and no unauthorized vehicles.
