Hovingham with Scackleton Parish Council Meeting

Wednesday 17th January 2024 at 7PM in the Community Room of Hovingham Village Hall

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING – Approved. The minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 22nd November 2023 be signed as a correct record.

REPORTS from NYC Council – Cllr. Steve Mason of NYC was invited to meeting and unable to attend

GENERAL ACTIONS (Hovingham & Scackleton)

- Bus services for Hovingham & Scackleton
 - > Malton to Helmsley 194 service has improved a great deal since Nov 2023
 - > Haven't had results of the NYC consultation. They'll be renegotiating contracts in April
 - Problems with the Ryedale Red Rover service, run by Ryedale Community Transport between Malton and Helmsley on Tuesdays and Fridays. When pre-booked told service was not running, sometime only on school holidays, so not reliable
- Drainage & Flooding
 - Environment Agency visited Mark and the Estate brought them up to speed on the situation at Hovingham. What works and ideas for improvements.
 - Consultation, for residents and business flood doors, is going through- Alice said she'd chase various people/ organisations
 - > WhatsApp group has been set up for Beckside residents and volunteers.
- Grass Cutting and Verge Wilding
 - Project promoted by National Landscapes (formerly AONB) suggest a new project for Mossburn Bank. Project Purple are organising the local volunteering.
 - Rather than cut it, they want to let it grow only cut once, identifying the differences between the flowers that are left and perhaps new ones to be planted.
 - They will cut around the perimeter due to road safety. There are other areas that could be used too outside the sewage farm in Hovingham and part of the playground.
 - This was unanimously agreed.

- Moseys Update
 - Meeting that involved North Yorkshire Councillors and Highways Officer Richard Marr
 - > The drains that are affected, Richard said he would assess them
 - Suggestion of rumble strips to collate data of how many lorries are passing through the village everyday- this will be done over a period of a month.
 - > Resident Pat gave an explanation of the ensuing process and the possible actions PC can take
 - Serena to thank Caroline Goodrick, Richard Marr (NYCC Highways), George Jabbour and Steve Mason for attending that meeting
 - > Richard Marr is getting back to Steve Mason with a predicted cost for speedstrips etc
- Planning
 - > Neighbourhood Plan meeting- successful details given to everyone
 - The proposal would be that council needs to agree to proceed with a plan
 - Need a forum of 3/4 people (Set up by council and ratifies matters) which is Hovingham- centric, then combine Scackleton
 - Everyone unanimously agrees to go ahead with plan
 - > Serena will send out communication about a group meeting
- Quarry Update
 - > The proposal would be that council needs to agree to proceed with a plan
 - > Wath Quarry is now owned by Chris Peacock, wants to open again and extend the planning
 - Incorrect details, planners need to be aware of on planning application: Can see the quarry from a footpath, 40 lorries a day going in and out. Traffic implications are unclear.
 - Serena to contact Peacocks about traffic movements and operating hours
- Woodland Proposal in Scackleton.
 - Alice says David from Tilhill has submitted an application to the Forestry Commission with a decision by April
 - > The Parish Council and residents need to see details of it and updates on progress
 - > Wait for David to respond to the email PC sent and confirm otherwise Serena to continue chasing

SCACKLETON ACTIONS

- > Action Group Report circulated and published on village website
- > A pothole has been reported to NYC Highways and filled in quickly
- > A possible sink hole on Coulton Bank, this is being looked into (!) The weather has been too bad it assess the risk.
- ➤ 3 residents have died since mid- December

HOVINGHAM ACTIONS

- Hovingham group action report circulated and published on village website
- > Hovingham Calendar been a success with plenty of contributions from photographers
- School Visit to the school, organised by Alice. Nothing can be done for a year, change of use, planning application etc. National landscapes have expressed an interest.
- Grass outside school in a very poor state- there are also ridges which are also dangerous. Hovingham estate's responsibility to maintain it. Serena to write email about issues.
- Village Maintenance
 - Hovingham wall Need to report to building control they will determine who is responsible for it. Get contact from Richard Marr.
 - **Footpaths** contact Pathways about path near tennis court and bowls club. Get contact from Richard Marr.
 - Beck railings: chase work to be done on railings. Serena to escalate complaint
 - Finger posts- repairs and painting- Giles will follow up
 - **Turning circle** Borthwick Institute responded to say they don't have any certificates. Send to Richard Marr. Jayne to chase .
 - **Grit:** Following cold spell in December £300 of grit purchased from NYC
- > **Parking:** £100 of parking donations over Christmas period.
