Heavy Traffic

- The determination of the CLOPUD was a win win for Mosey and the Local Planning Authority. He got what he wanted and neither party had to go through the embarrassment of Public Inquiry.
- Public Inquiries are a very good thing in that it enables the public to put their point across and say what they like as long as it is not slanderous or libelous.
- What I think is key is to continue to push for the TRO along the length of Coulton Lane this would necessitate a Public Inquiry if it included any time limit on loading and unloading. I have explained in the past the balancing exercise in S122(2) of the RTRA 1984 and how this is helpful. The Parish Council should push Richard Marr for the traffic stats on THIS first.
- Second, the Parish Council should push the LPA with regard to making the questions raised and answers to the Planning Contravention Notice within the public domain. They will resist this as they may not have, nor want to ask the difficult questions i.e. has he installed a second and third production line.
- Please remember that Condition 2 ("No machinery or other equipment shall be introduced or installed which would have the effect of increasing the current capacity of the mill without the prior written approval of the Local Planning Authority.") has been a condition since 09/00290/MFUL i.e. in 2009 when he was producing only 2,500 tonnes per month as opposed to 25,854. (Patrick)

- We have started with our new grass cutter and all is going well and the playground continues to look neat and well cared for.

Project Purple

- Project Purple have received a locality grant from Cllr Mason of £1168 for 2024/5
- The wilding project has the go ahead from the Estate and now NYCC and final details are being organised.
- Cowslips are being planted this week to supplement the other local species with a group of the volunteers helping with this.
- In the autumn a cut of the area will be done and a likely survey of species undertaken.
- Project Purple would like to fund and install a bike service station and electric bike and mobility charging station at the Village Hall. We are waiting for the feedback from the Parish council and Village Hall Committee. We hope this will receive positive endorsement at the PC meeting on the Wednesday.
- On the 8th June we have a Repair Cafe and Community Hub in the Village Hall, everyone welcome. (Frank)

Village Market
