Village Market

- The market is holding its own financially and we now have a waiting list. Sadly, we get inundated with cake stalls so we limit them.
- Last market [July] was disappointing as numbers were down and the stall holders on the whole did not do well. This we feel was partly due to the weather and the car show which we feel reduced the number of regular visitors, there is always a hard core of regular locals from within a five-mile radius and these were lacking. However, amazingly the café run by the Church did very well. Every café this year has made over £700 at the market which is very satisfying.
- The market along with the village hall and the parish council is looking at building a new structure between the two white beam trees to house the market trolleys and cones.
- We feel where they are at present is an eye sore and detracts from the ambience of the village, so if we could hide them, it would be far better and also stop them being "borrowed" and not returned, we have had to buy extra cones this year as some have gone missing.
- Finally, we have been concerned re stall holders parking in then main street especially in front of the village shop. I have had discussions with them, so we now put cones out in front of the shop stating "parking for village shop only"
- The shop also complained about the play group mothers parking in front of the shop on a Wednesday preventing those who would use the shop being able to park.

 it is with no cliques. Shy people who have trouble making friends have been able to find their mum tribe and credit the
 playgroup with them making new friends and enjoying their new baby. We have had more than one mother open up
 about mental health issues too and how the playgroup helped with that. The group is definitely achieving what it set out
 to do.
- Although I am no longer able to commit to every week with my own daughter starting school, I do hope to keep in touch with the new team and I am always on the end of the phone.
