Thank you for your letter dated 2nd July. In response to this, we wanted to inform you about the steps we are taking which we hope will reduce the impact of our vehicles on Hovingham.

At Ian Mosey Group, we want to protect the future of our family-run business, while supporting our local community.

We have already shared information about the new barriers that we have installed at the feed mill, which supports compliance with agreed operating hours.

We are committed to promoting a culture of safety throughout our business. Specifically, we will be adopting a series of measures in the coming months to support our drivers.

This will include encouraging safer driving through monitoring and coaching. We are also intending to introduce a reduced speed limit for our drivers in Hovingham of 20mph.

Over time, we hope there will be other steps we can take to minimise the impact on Hovingham. We would be very happy to arrange a face to face meeting in the coming weeks with a representative from the Hovingham Parish Council to discuss this matter in more detail. We will be in contact soon to organise this.
