Project Purple

- Project Purple have received a grant from NYMNPA for £1867 and £1168 from Cllr Steve Mason's Locality Budget toward the bike station in the village hall car park. This will include a charger and repair stand. The PC and VH Committee have also supported the project. We hope to install this in October.
- The wilding project had a hiccup with an unscheduled cutting. We hope this has not put back the project. Waiting on HHNL to verify this year's outcome. Special thanks to all the support we had with the unscheduled racking and disposing of the cuttings.
- PP has funded a £345 software upgrade the EV charging station to prevent it from becoming redundant!
- The charger can be activated using a BP Pulse RFID card or by simply downloading the BP Pulse Pay As You Go app.
