3	Report North Yorkshire Councillor Steve Mason: - No report received

5	<p>General Actions (Hovingham and Scackleton): -</p> <p>a. Drainage & Flooding.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brookside Flood Scheme, Mark contacted NYC again and NYC have now provided temporary flood barriers for the bakery. NYC have promised that flood doors will be provided as the long-term solution but funding, timeline and other issues have slowed everything down. Mark will continue to chase them. Residents have been informed of this update via WhatsApp. • Yorkshire Water are to shortly replace a section of leaking pipe near Tufts Lane. They will fence off the pipe route to protect the pipe. This is a helpful step but there are issues eastward with connecting pipelines leading into Paddy’s Wood. • Mark advised that some beck clearance of vegetation near Pasture House has been done, but it was superficial. Further clearing is needed. • Hovingham Flood Plan is to be reviewed by Mark and Ann <p>b. GP Surgery – Services available in Hovingham</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ann and Jayne met with Penny Coldbeck (Practice Manager) on 22nd November to discuss this, mainly focusing on communications and funding. Summary will be produced shortly. <p>c. Grass Cutting –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cutting is completed until Springtime2025. January’s meeting will discuss 2025, quotes etc. <p>d. Moseys Planning update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Moseys Discussions. We have had 2 meetings with Moseys and they have suggested various mitigations such as 20mph, back hauling etc. It is too soon to say that this will be effective. We will meet with them again in January and hope then to have a better idea of whether anything positive will result. • Planning Contravention Notice update (Breach 23/00071/BC) relating to the plant capacity. Ann Rawlinson (NYC planning) has advised they will be visiting the Mill. Patrick Meagher has prepared an extract of planning documents relating to this and we have sent them to Ann Rawlinson stating our support for the investigation. • Analysis of the new data from the data strips positioned at Moseys Mill were inconsistent and ineffective. It is thought that the technology is not up to the task. Item closed. <p>e. Neighbourhood Plan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Parish Council team have developed a Terms of Reference document to provide a clear way forward for the Steering Group. The full Parish Council have now approved this document. The team will meet again on December 6th to finalise details for the Getting Started meeting, likely to be held in mid- January. <p>f. North Yorkshire Council “Call for sites” Call for Sites - Details - Keyplan (objective.co.uk)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NYCC call for sites process is still in the assessment stage. As consultees we will be informed when consultation starts <p>g. Cell phone coverage</p> <p>Peter Cole (Parish liaison) gave me contact details for NYC cell phone coverage program manager Michael Grayson - Michael.Grayson@northyorks.gov.uk</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Michael mentioned the Shared Rural Network scheme but said it didn’t apply in our case, so we have no immediate options. • OFCOM does not accept complaints, but we can contact the network providers. • We will research this further and then send out a briefing document for you with any options available. • Nicole and Steve, can you confirm coverage is an issue in Scackleton as well please?

Trees and hedges are causing lorries to swing wide and thus damage the road edges. NYC are monitoring this, so nothing for the Parish Council to do now. Item Closed.</p> <p>b. Woodland Proposal in Scackleton</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The grant and plans are now awaiting Sir William’s approval before detailed planting plans can be created and shared with residents. • A biodiversity grant has been offered to Hovingham Estate <p>c. Wild Scackleton – an initiative from Nicholas Burrows at NYC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is thought Manor Farm and Highfield House will be involved. 7	<p>Hovingham Actions: -</p> <p>a. Hovingham Action Group Report: - Full report attached to minutes on website (www.hovingham.org.uk/council)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Railings on Mossburn Bank and Coronation cottage will be painted in the Spring. • Hovingham Market is looking for a volunteer to manage Stallholder communications • The Bike Charger has been installed at the Village Hall. <p>b. Cemetery</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A full review of processes and records is still to be undertaken. • An issue with a family disagreement with headstone wording has been referred back to the family for resolution. Jayne/Ann will check the removed headstone site for safety status. <p>c. Village Maintenance Peter Cole (Parish Liaison – part of Localities Team) was to chase these items however, time has passed so I asked for contact details for relevant departments and am chasing these myself.</p> <p>1. Beck railings are in poor condition.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will photograph the area and itemise the damage to the posts and rails in details. We will then chase NYC on safety grounds <p>2. Boundary Wall with Myse Restaurant.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We have sent full details of the location of this wall to NYC and are awaiting an answer on ownership? • It is proposed to ‘make the wall secure’ with contributions (without prejudice) from Village Hall, Market, Parish Council, Myse and Hovingham Estate. This will not be a full restoration of the wall, as no-one claims ownership or liability. <p>3. Myse removal of mounting step.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Myse have applied for Planning Permission for a like for like repair. The Parish Council having seen the details have logged ‘support’ for this work and informed Myse. • Timeframes are unknown. <p>4. Brookside and other Verge Damage.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We now have contact details for the correct department and I will chase NYC and report back on NYC policy on verge damage. <p>5. Layby removal on Brandsby Road.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Estate want NYC to remove these laybys as they are on Estate land. NYC are now saying they own the land, so there is an impasse. It is being referred for legal advice. <p>6. Tennis Court Pathway</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This work has been completed. Thank you to Frank Colenso’s team for organising this. • A sign is planned to thank the Howardian Hills for their funding.
