3	 Report North Yorkshire Councillor Steve Mason: - a. Locality budget has been halved and other cuts are coming through b. Concerns over lack of community engagement c. School Transport under review d. S106 monies; Phil was able to confirm that our Parish Council has no S106 monies outstanding. e. Sewerage issues and water quality of rivers f. Speeding issue is now centralised at NYC head office, rather than the local area g. New home collection bins. Roll out continues. Parish Councillors asked that Steve provide details of returning large bins for smaller bins, what can go in each bin and bin collection regime. This will go out on notice boards and Email Diary.

5	 General Actions (Hovingham and Scackleton): - a. Drainage & Flooding. Brookside Flood Scheme, the funding bid is now approved, we are now awaiting next steps to be defined with Watertight re rollout (May 19th hopefully). Mark will chase then week commencing 26th May. Residents have been told each property will be individually approached. Beck clearance near Pasture House requires further clearing. Mark has asked Ian Cooke (EA) to provide timelines. Hovingham Flood (and Emergency) Plan, Mark and Ann have circulated this document and the Parish Council have approved it. It will now be registered at NYC. Diversion culvert needs clearing – The estate has reprofiled the culvert and supported the edges with steel The Parish Council have made a £200 payment towards these costs. Mark and Ann will meet with the Estate to sort out a proactive program for maintenance Mark has completed a map of all Gullies in Hovingham village (some 80 or so) this will form part of the overall Flood Risk Assessment for Hovingham – Item closed Two blocked gullies (Manor House and Old School House) have been logged with NYC. 	 Moseys Planning update Moseys Discussions. Jayne and Ann will meet them again on June 2nd. The 20mph rollout continues and is having a significant positive effect. We will continue to work for more improvement. Planning Contravention Notice update (Breach 23/00071/BC) relating to the plant capacity. NYC have advised on 9th May that the legal team had not in fact been briefed and so Enforcement are still awaiting a legal opinion (originally expected mid-April). After we chased Enforcement again, they advised on 21st May that: "we have now received some initial advice back from our legal colleagues regarding the relevant condition which I will be looking to discuss further and review with Ann Rawlinson shortly". 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General Actions (Hovingham and Scackleton): continued Giles e. Neighbourhood Plan Further meetings continue. Giles is now the primary Parish Council representative on this group, with Mark Wilson as backup. Meeting with North Yorkshire Council Officer, Matthew Lishman, May 28th Meeting (informal chat) with a Planning Consultant, early June followed by a Steering Group meeting (first meeting with Giles). The Planning Consultant suggested that we may hear about funding early June Funding Request for Microsoft 365 – submitted to the Parish Council for approval Complete the review of the Constitution Complete the Terms of Reference (minor edits) and the outcome of the Parish Council decision (when made) about the Code of Conduct. Ann **North Yorkshire Council Local Plan** "Local Plan" Consultation on NYC documents relating to preparation of a Local Plan have been released. The main document is 160 pages and time and effort will be required to decide how to take this forward. Responses are entered online. Consultation closes 15th July. https://northyorks-consult.objective.co.uk/kse/ https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/localplan Ann will assemble some information for the Parish Council and a decision on how to proceed will be needed from the team. Some urgency will be needed on this. "Call for sites" Call for Sites - Details - Keyplan (objective.co.uk) NYCC call for sites was released on 31st January 2025. No sites have been assessed or graded for suitability. 1700 sites have been submitted across North Yorkshire. As consultees we will be informed when consultation starts. g. Cell phone coverage - NYC cell phone coverage program manager Michael Grayson -Michael.Grayson@northyorks.gov.uk Ofcom website confirms coverage is patchy in Scackleton and Hovingham. A position paper on the problem was send to Steve Mason for his action. He advises this has been referred to the AAC (Area Committee?) Scackleton Actions: - a. Action Group Report attached to minutes on website (www.hovingham.org.uk/council) b. Woodland Proposal in Scackleton Planting has been done in North West and North East sections. Planting appears a bit more Nicole uniform than the Parkland profile which was the intention Residents have still not seen the plans. c. Wild Scackleton – an initiative from Nicholas Burrows at NYC Steve Manor Farm and Highfield House have now had approved planning permission for the ponds. 7 **Hovingham Actions:** a. Cemetery A full review of processes and records has now begun. A burial Register was found by a Ann/ former Parish Clerk and covers about 1968 to 2003.
