	 a. GP Surgery – Nicole and Ann will meet with Penny Coldbeck, hopefully in December, and find out the latest position and try to clear up the confusions and rumours that abound. A planned earlier meeting during October and November was delayed due to the CQC inspection. It appears that nursing appointments are no longer available at Hovingham and there is some confusion about blood tests. Patient transport is likely to be a big issue.
